INTRODUCTION

1. Since the introduction of a Resource Allocation Framework in 2005, the GEF Secretariat has reported to the GEF Council at every Council meeting on its implementation. The previous progress report on the System for Transparent Allocation of Resources (STAR) for the allocation of GEF-5 resources was submitted to the Council in November 2012.
2. This current report consists of the following parts: (i) Cumulative Utilizations of the STAR resources for GEF-5 for the period July 1, 2010 to May 15, 2013; (ii) Remaining Funds relative to country allocations after the cumulative utilizations are taken into account; and (iii) Future Potential Utilizations under STAR that were recommended by the CEO for inclusion into the work program, pending approval by the Council at its forthcoming meeting in June 2013. All data is discussed in aggregate numbers as well as by regional classifications. The GEF regions are listed in Annex 1.
3. The data in this report is calculated against the original allocations of GEF-5 of \$4,250 million. As noted in GEF/C.44/07, *Update on GEF-5 Programming*, the Secretariat has followed the recommendation of the Council from its November 2012 meeting, whereby programming was undertaken maintaining the balance among the original allocations in the GEF-5 replenishment decision, assisting least-developed countries (LDCs) and small island developing states (SIDS) in accessing resources, and supporting core obligations to the conventions for which the GEF is a or the financial mechanism. The Secretariat has suggested to the Council that a similar approach be continued for the remainder of GEF-5.
4. Given a projected shortfall of \$184 million against the original GEF-5 envelope of \$4,250 million, it is unlikely that all remaining (unutilized) country allocations will be programmed during the remainder of GEF-5.

UTILIZATIONS

5. Table 1 summarizes the cumulative utilizations for GEF-5 for the three focal areas to which STAR is applied. Detailed country utilizations can be found in Annex 2. Utilization figures are country-specific and do not include global and regional projects, which are funded from the 20 percent exclusion resources. Aggregate figures on these utilizations can be found in Annex 3.

7. Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region has the highest overall regional utilization rate of 70 percent. The Europe and Central Asia (ECA) region has the lowest of 58 percent.

8. Latin America and the Caribbean region and the Africa region tie for the highest rates of utilization in the biodiversity focal area, both with a utilization rate of 74 percent. Europe and Central Asia region has the lowest utilization rate for biodiversity of 51 percent.

9. The Africa region has the lowest utilization rate for the climate change focal area, of 42 percent. The LAC region has the highest, of 63 percent.

10. The Asia region has the lowest utilization rate for land degradation, at 58 percent. The LAC region has the highest, at 74 percent.

11. The LAC region is in fact the top performer in utilizations, both overall and for each individual focal area. The Africa region ties with the LAC for the highest utilization in biodiversity but has the lowest in climate change. The ECA region has the lowest utilization rates both overall and in the biodiversity focal area.

Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs)

12. Table 3 summarizes the allocations and utilizations for the countries that are categorized as “Small Island Developing States” (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs)¹.

REMAINING FUNDS

13. Annex 2 illustrates the original GEF-5 allocations, the cumulative utilization of countries, and the remainder of the initial allocations that are available for programming (calculated as the initial allocation less the cumulative utilization). All data is presented by country and by focal area. As noted in paragraph 4 the remaining allocations are unlikely to be fully programmed given the projected shortfall in the GEF-5 resource envelope.

14. Various negative figures are evident in the focal area columns for some countries. This demonstrates that several countries have at this point exceeded their initial allocations in the relevant focal areas. However, due to the GEF’s “flexibility policy” in the STAR, these individual overruns did not have a negative impact on the country’s allocation and utilization figures. Table 4 summarizes the numbers of countries to fall into each one of the flexibility categories. Annex 4 outlines the details of the flexibility policy.

FUTURE POTENTIAL UTILIZATIONS: THE JUNE 2013 WORK PROGRAM

15. The GEF Secretariat has prepared a Work Program with CEO-recommended PIFS for Council approval in June 2013. The *Work Program* (GEF/C.44/08) highlights the project information and proposed amounts for GEF funding and agency fees, as well as total Work Program funds. Annex 5 lists country utilizations and remaining amounts after the June Work Program funds are incorporated into the utilization numbers.

16. Examining Annex 5, it is clear that for many countries, the new utilizations are within their original focal area allocations. For the countries that now lie outside of their original focal area allocations, the flexibility rules must be applied.

17. Annex 6 outlines the status of each country after the June 2013 work program, and the necessary adjustments to their focal area allocations based on their flexibility or marginal adjustment status.

18. Table 5 summarizes the Cumulative Utilizations inclusive of the June 2013 work program.

20. With the June 2013 Work Program included, the LAC region has the highest overall utilizations of 79 percent, and the region of Africa has the lowest at 68 percent.

21. The Asia region has the highest utilisation for the biodiversity focal area at 82 percent; the Europe and Central Asia region has the lowest at 51 percent.

22. The LAC region has the highest utilisation for the climate change focal area at 78 percent; the Africa region has the lowest at 52 percent.

23. The ECA region has the highest utilisation for the land degradation focal area at 81 percent; the Asia region has the lowest at 70 percent.

24. The Africa region has the lowest utilisation rate both overall and for the climate change focal area. Whereas the Asia region has the highest utilisation rate for Biodiversity, it has the lowest for land degradation. The ECA region has the highest utilisation rate for land degradation but the lowest for Biodiversity. The LAC region has both the highest utilisation rate for climate change, and the highest overall utilisation rate of all four regions.

Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs)

25. Table 7 summarizes the allocations and utilizations for the countries that are categorized as “Small Island Developing States” (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs).

26. It is noteworthy that the utilization of the SIDS and LDC countries have undergone significant increases in the last six months. Table 8 summarises the utilization rates:

27. Before the November 2012 Work Program, the SIDS had utilized only 28 percent of their overall allocations. With the inclusion of the June 2013 Work Program, this utilization has almost tripled. For LDCs over the same period, there was a significant increase in overall utilizations from 42 percent to 73 percent.

28. At its meeting in November 2012, under agenda item 15, the Council reviewed document GEF/C.34/08, Financial Projections for GEF-5 Programming Options and agreed, *inter-alia*, that SIDS and LDCs should be assisted in accessing resources. The increases reported in Table 8 are therefore noteworthy.

Annex 4. RULES OF FLEXIBILITY

The Flexibility Policy allows a country with a total STAR allocation amount of less than US\$ 7 million to flexibly use its STAR funds in any of the focal areas.

Countries are categorized as “fully flexible” or “not flexible” based on this rule. However, for countries that are “not flexible”, some marginal movements of funds between focal areas are in fact possible. The overall rules that govern flexibility of funds are as follows:

- (a) For countries whose total initial allocations are less than 7 million, they are permitted unlimited marginal adjustments among focal areas (fully flexible)
- (b) For countries whose total initial allocations are between 7 and 20 million, they are permitted marginal adjustments up to \$200 000
- (c) For countries whose total initial allocations are between 20 and 100 million, they are permitted marginal adjustments up to \$1 million
- (d) For countries whose total initial allocations are greater than 100 million, they are permitted marginal adjustments up to \$2 million

A fully flexible country is therefore free to re-allocate its initial allocation between focal areas. However, countries that are only permitted limited marginal adjustments do not have the freedom to move unlimited resources among their focal areas. Such countries are only permitted to move between focal areas the amounts that are within their allowable adjustment bands.
