

Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and

Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF)

February 22, 2010

The Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) was established under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) at it seventh session in Marrakech in 2002¹, and it is managed by the Global Environment Facility (GEF). The Fund addresses the special needs of the Least Developed Countries (LDCs), which are especially vulnerable to the adverse impacts of climate change. This includes preparing and implementing National Adaptation Programmes of Action (NAPAs), which aim is to identify "urgent and immediate needs" of each LDC according to specific guidelines provided by the Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG).²

The GEF has, as of February 2010, mobilized voluntary contributions of \$200 million for the LDCF, including pledges.

The Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF) was established under the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)³ in 2001 to finance activities, programs and measures relating to climate change that are complementary to those funded by the resources allocated to the climate change focal area of the GEF and by bilateral and multilateral funding.

The SCCF has four different windows:

- Adaptation
- Transfer of technologies
- Energy, transport, industry, agriculture, forestry, and waste management
- Activities to assist developing countries whose economies are highly dependent on income generated from the production, processing, and export or on consumption of fossil fuels and associated energy-intensive products in diversifying their economies

The Parties to the Climate Convention identified adaptation to climate change as the top priority of the SCCF. The SCCF serves as a catalyst to leverage additional resources from bilateral and other multilateral sources.

The GEF has, as of February 2010, mobilized voluntary contributions of \$105 million for the adaptation program under the SCCF.

Governance of the Funds: For purposes of the LDCF and the SCCF, the GEF would function under the guidance of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP)⁴.

With respect to decision making for the LDCF and SCCF, the Council will meet as the Council for the LDCF and the SCCF (hereafter referred to as the LDCF/SCCF Council). Any Council Member is eligible to take part in the LDCF/SCCF Council. Any Council Member may choose to participate in the LDCF/SCCF Council or to attend as an observer.

The policies and procedures and the governance structure of the GEF apply to the climate change funds, unless the LDCF/SCCF Council decides it is necessary to modify such policies and procedures to be responsive to the guidance of the COP⁵.

All GEF documents regarding the governance of the LDCF and SCCF are publicly available on the GEF website (www.thegef.org).

As stated above, the LDCF and SCCF follow the GEF's policies and rules in all aspects of their operations (such as fiduciary standards, streamlined project cycle, result-based frameworks, and monitoring and evaluation practices, among others) except for when the LDCF/SCCF Council decides otherwise in response to COP guidance, as appropriate.

The LDCF and SCCF are seminal in climate change adaptation finance and were built on prominent assessments such as the U.S. adaptation country studies.

The Global Environment Facility makes publicly available on its website the documents that address the following information:

1. The criteria used to determine which programs and activities receive funds, and the manner in which such programs and activities meet such criteria. These are elaborated for the LDCF in the "Programming Paper for Funding the Implementation of NAPAs under the LDC Trust Fund" (GEF/C.28/18). For the SCCF, this is elaborated in the "Programming to Implement the Guidance for the Special Climate Change Fund Adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and its Ninth Session" (GEF/C.24/12).

These papers were drafted in response to COP guidance (including the United States) from COP7 (Decision7/CP.7), and were approved by the GEF Council (including the United States), as per documents publicly available on the GEF website.⁶

2. The extent of local involvement in such programs and activities. The LDCF and SCCF follow the GEF public involvement policy approved by the GEF Council in 1996 and consistent with the provision of the Instrument for the Establishment of the Restructured GEF, which sets for explicitly the need for public involvement, the basic provisions of which state that all GEF-financed projects will "provide for full disclosure of non-confidential information, and consultation with, and participation as appropriate of, major groups and local communities throughout the project cycle." (p. 12, Basic Provisions, para. 5)

In addition, the Programming Paper for Funding the Implementation of NAPAs under the LDC Trust Fund further explicitly requires **stakeholder consultation** in the formulation of NAPAs and subsequent project implementation, which is supportive of

high local involvement and the SCCF trust fund explicitly require that projects demonstrate local benefits⁷.

- **3. The amount of funds provided:** The following are <u>publicly available</u> from the <u>LDCF/SCCF meeting documents page</u> on the GEF website:
 - Status reports (prepared by the Trustee), which report on the current status of funds, are presented to the LDCF/SCCF council twice a year.
 - Progress reports (prepared by the GEF Secretariat), which report on the current status of activities and approved operations under the LDCF and the SCCF, are prepared and presented to the LDCF/SCCF council twice a year.
 - COP reports, prepared with input from implementing agencies and presented at the COP yearly.
 - Evaluations, or any related documents that may be available.
- 4. Results achieved: The LDCF and SCCF are seminal in climate change adaptation finance. The LDCF, in particular, is the first and most comprehensive adaptation action-focused program currently in operation (as opposed to studies and assessment-focused) for least developed countries (LDCs). The information regarding the results achieved under the operations of these funds are made publicly available on the GEF website as LDCF/SCCF Council documents as described under the previous point. Although the project portfolio is quite new to measure results, the following are the implementation highlights:

Key results achieved under the LDCF as of February 2010

- 43 of the funded NAPAs have been completed and published at the UNFCCC website.
- 17 projects have been CEO endorsed for Bangladesh, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Cambodia, Cape Verde, Democratic Republic of Congo, Eritrea, Guinea, Maldives, Mali, Niger, Rwanda, Samoa, Sudan, Tuvalu, and Zambia and are now under implementation. At least 3 more projects are expected to move to the implementation phase before the end of 2010 in Lesotho, Sierra Leone, and Vanuatu.
- The LDCs, despite their small economies and limited institutional and technical capacities, are now among the most advanced in the world with respect to cutting edge actions to reduce vulnerability and increase adaptive capacity to the adverse impacts of climate change.

> Key results achieved under the SCCF adaptation program as of February 2010:

• 14 projects have been CEO endorsed and are now under implementation for national, regional and global projects covering 27 countries: Barbados, Bhutan,

Bolivia, China, Cook Islands, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, Guyana, Jordan, Kenya, Mexico, Micronesia, Mozambique, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Peru, Philippines, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tanzania, Tonga, Tuvalu, Uzbekistan, Vanuatu, and Zimbabwe.

Additional specific information regarding funding provided and results achieved:

under LDCF:

- The GEF has, as of February 2010, mobilized voluntary contributions of \$190 million for the LDCF.
- 48 of 50 eligible LDCs have received a total of \$10.6 million in support to prepare their NAPAs⁸.
- 35 countries have officially submitted their first NAPA implementation projects under the LDCF.
- 36 NAPA implementation project proposals have been approved and had the necessary funding reserved. A round total of \$121 million has been approved (i.e. disbursed, committed, or allocated) for concrete action in 33 LDCs.

under SCCF:

- The GEF has, as of February 2010, mobilized voluntary contributions of \$105 million for the adaptation program under the SCCF.
- 21 SCCF project proposals have been approved and had the necessary funding reserved since operationalization of the Fund. A round total of \$95 million has been approved (i.e. disbursed, committed, or allocated) for concrete action in non-annex I countries.

Additional information on the status and funding of LDCF and SCCF Trust Funds, including NAPA preparation, is summarized in **Tables 1 – 3**.
