ANNOTATED PROVISIONAL AGENDA

AGENDA ITEM 1. OPENING OF THE MEETING

1. The meeting will be opened by Leonard Good, CEO/Chairperson of the Facility.

AGENDA ITEM 2. OPTIONS FOR A RESOURCE ALLOCATION FRAMEWORK

(a) Presentation by the Secretariat

- 2. At its meeting in May 2004, the GEF Council requested the Secretariat to convene a seminar in September 2004 to advance its work on the development of a resource allocation framework for the GEF. In preparation for the seminar, the Secretariat was requested to prepare a more detailed document for the seminar proposing additional options and simulations for a resource allocation framework.
- 3. The Secretariat has prepared a report presenting three options (and associated simulations) for Council discussion. All three options are based on two basic components, which the Council agreed should constitute a resource allocation framework for the GEF: (i) assessments of country-potential to generate global environmental benefits in the focal areas of biodiversity and climate change; and (ii) ratings of country-performance based on macro, sectoral, and portfolio performance indicators.
- 4. The Secretariat will present the paper to the seminar.

(b) Presentation of IFAD's experience

5. At its meeting in May 2004, the Council also noted that it would be useful to invite a representative of another institution with relevant experience in designing a resource allocation framework, such as IFAD, to participate in the seminar. The representative of IFAD will be invited to make a presentation to the seminar on its experience in establishing a resource allocation system.

(c) Discussion of options

6. The seminar will be invited to discuss the options presented in the paper with a view to exploring which option may generate consensus support.

AGENDA ITEM 3. OUTSTANDING ISSUES

7. In preparation for the Council meeting in November 2004, there are a number of additional issues that will need to be addressed before a resource allocation framework may become operational. The Secretariat will present initial list to the seminar. The seminar will be invited to identify additional issues and to have a preliminary exchange of views so as to facilitate the Secretariat's work in preparing appropriate material for review by the Council at its meeting in November

8. The seminar will be invited to agree on next steps in advancing the work of the Council to establish a resource allocation framework.
