GBF Fund Background

- CBD COP 15 held in Montreal Canada under Chinese COP Presidency, from December 7 to 20, 2022
- Landmark COP to adopt Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity
 Framework (GBF) with 4 goals, 23 targets
 - Bring about transformation in our societies' relationship with nature
 - To fulfill the shared vision of living in harmony with nature by 2050

- New Fund to be established within GEF
- ✓ GBF Fund to support implementation of GBF

Global Biodiversity Framework Trust Fund

- Establish a dedicated and accessible fund in 2023 that can quickly mobilize and disburse new and additional resources from all sources, commensurate with the ambition of the GBF.
- GEF requested to establish, in 2023, and until 2030 unless the COP decides otherwise, a Special Trust Fund to support GBF implementation (GBF Fund), "...to complement existing support and scale up financing to ensure its timely implementation, taking into account the need for adequacy, predictability, and the timely flow of funds."
- GEF requested to make arrangements to allow the GBF Fund to receive financing from all sources in addition to ODA, to design and implement a simple and effective project cycle for easy and efficient access, and calls upon the GEF to approve these decisions at the next possible session of the Council and its ratification at the next possible session of the Assembly in 2023.

Establishment of the Global Biodiversity Framework Fund


The Council, having reviewed document GEF/C.64/10, Establishment of a New Trust Fund: The Global Biodiversity Framework Fund, approves the arrangements proposed for the establishment of a new trust fund, with the aim to support the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework.

The Council invites the World Bank to act as Trustee for the new Global Biodiversity Framework Fund.

Programming Directions

The Council, having reviewed the Programming Directions of the Global Biodiversity Fund (Document GEF/C.64/XX), endorses/approves the programming directions including the principles set forth therein by which resources will be allocated.

GBF Trust Fund: Key Points



GBF Trust Fund: Organization



- Part of funds with the GEF: "GEF family of funds"
- World Bank invited to serve as Trustee
- 18 GEF Agencies
- GEF policies, procedures and governance structure will apply to the GBF Fund, unless the Council decides it is necessary to modify such policies and procedures to be responsive to COP guidance
 - **Project cycle simplification** proposed in response to COP guidance with a simple and effective application and approval process, and to provide easy and efficient access to resources of the GBF Fund

Trust Fund that serves CBD, CCD, Minamata Convention, Stockholm Convention, UNFCCC

GBF Trust Fund: Governance (1/2)



- GEF Council to meet as the Council for the GBF Fund: GBF Fund Council
- Based on balanced and equitable representation in accordance with the GEF Instrument, with majority developing country members
 - 16 Members from developing countries
 - 14 Members from developed countries
 - 2 Members from the countries of central and eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union
- GBF Fund Council decisions to be taken by consensus
- Double-weighted majority formal voting if consensus is not reached

GBF Trust Fund: Governance (2/2)



- Expanded list of observers invited to attend, with opportunities to provide written/oral statements in case of voting
 - * Current Council observers (civil society)
 - * Private sector * Philanthropic and conservation organizations
 - * Indigenous Peoples and local communities
 - * Youth


- * Women
- GEF Agencies, the Trustee, STAP, IEO invited to attend
- CBD Secretariat invited to attend, and other MEAs

GBF Trust Fund: Resources



- GBF Fund set up to accept non-sovereign contributions, in addition to ODA
- Support from all sources as per GBF Target 19
- Broadened donor base
- Voluntary contributions
- Informed by each country's response to resource mobilization strategy agreed at COP 15

GBF Trust Fund: Fund Structure



- Exploring a trust fund with option to add more programs, or windows
- Support discrete activities for each program/window
- Ability to earmark resources to a specific program/window
- Programming Directions to clarify eligible activities and rules of engagement
- Fund to approve projects until December 2030


GBFF Programing Directions Mandate/Decision from COP 15



• Respond to the COP decision, CBD/COP/DEC/15/15, paragraph 20:

Requests the Global Environment Facility to establish, in 2023, and until 2030 unless the Conference of the Parties decides otherwise, a special trust fund to support the implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, to complement existing support and scale up financing to ensure its timely implementation, taking into account the need for adequacy, predictability, and timely flow of funds" (emphasis added)

GBF Programming Directions: Key Points for Discussion



Strategic Complementarity



Gaps in support to GBF implementation through GEF-8 programming options were identified and 8 Action Areas for the GBFF were developed based on the following criteria:

- Strong complementarity to the approaches of the biodiversity and other focal area strategies of the GEF Trust Fund and the Integrated Programs;
- Significant potential to leverage additional resources from all sources including philanthropies and the private sector;
- High potential to generate significant global environmental benefits.

Resource Allocation Options



- To be discussed further
- Differentiated allocation of resources proposed among groups of countries based on GEF-8 Biodiversity STAR allocation
- Consideration of global biodiversity value of countries AND potential contribution each country can make to deliver global BD benefits
- Establish a floor for LDCs and SIDS

- Covers November 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023
- Key activities: CBD, UNFCCC, CBD, Stockholm Convention, Minamata Convention
 - Outcomes from UNFCCC COP 27, CBD COP 15, Stockholm COP 11
 - Responses to COP guidance, national reporting, major meetings, Secretariat consultations
- Relations with other international institutions
 - Update on Biodiversity beyond National Jurisdiction (decision document)
 - Update on Marine Plastics treaty negotiations
 - Green Climate Fund (joint progress report on Long-Term Vision on complementarity)
 - Adaptation Fund, UN Forum on Forests, SAICM
