



UNEP GEF-8 strategy in Central Asia



- UNEP GEF CW portfolio has ongoing projects in the Central Asia region worth approximately 16 million USD.
- There is a shortage of EAs with capacity to execute full sized and regional projects. Other difficulties include lack of coverage by UN official language.
- Regional trends include increased: use of pesticides and fertilizers, increased spending in climate resilience, a potential increase for single use plastic water bottles due to lack of potable water, return of tourism post-covid, a rise in e-healthcare, increased advanced automation in the management of global supply chains and smart cities, and the emergence of the region as a new global economic center with an increase in E-waste, plastics and textile consumption as well as 3 space agencies with full launch capabilities.



Potential projects in the region include:



- IP 11: Elimination of hazardous chemicals from supply chains (53mil\$) with UNEP GEF CW as lead agency, the programme will be split into 2 value chains: Fashion and construction.
- Other potential initiatives:
 - ✓ Reducing mercury emissions though phasing out mercury-containing products, mercury waste management and introducing alternatives
 - ✓ Addressing hazardous fire-fighting foams replacement in selected large international hubs
 - ✓ Green and Sustainable Ports and Shipping links to CCM and IW
 - ✓ Build on the Kyrgyzstan and Mexico primary mercury mining projects to expand to other countries in the region (FSP)
 - ✓ Develop regional mercury trade projects (FSP regional)
 - ✓ Expansion of planetGOLD projects for eligible countries links to BD/LD on the Sumatran Rainforest management
 - ✓ Improving circularity for textiles used in uniforms and phase out of fossil fuel based synthetic polymers

Objective 2: Advance management in the Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction (ABNJ)

- GEF IW project on building <u>cross sectoral</u> <u>capacity for the management of</u> <u>resources</u> in common oceans with a case study in the Pacific
- Support to LMEs with ABNJ mandates through the RSP

Objective 3: Enhance water security in shared freshwater ecosystems

- History of support to TDA/SAP and SAP implementation in TB basins and Aquifers
- UNEA resolution on <u>sustainable lake management</u>
- A <u>Freshwater strategy</u> promoting **IWRM**
- Experience with aquaculture schemes in large river basins and transboundary lakes (Amazon and Lake Tanganyika) to be replicated
- Development of a <u>flood and drought management decision support tools</u> tested in Chao Praya (Thailand) to be used broadly
- Earth Observation wetland <u>mapping tool</u> (SDG 6.6.1) and is actively gathering and uploading IWRM SDG 6.5.1 data on an <u>online portal</u>.
- Support through global monitoring systems such as GEMS/Water and World Water Quality Alliance.
