1. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.35/03, [Work Program for the Least Developed Countries Fund and Special Climate Change Fund](#), approves the Work Program comprising of 21 projects, subject to comments made during the Council meeting and additional comments that may be submitted in writing to the Secretariat by March 9, 2024¹.

Decision LDCF.SCCF 7/2024 FY25 Administrative Budget and Business Plan for the Least Developed Countries Fund and the Special Climate Change Fund

1. The LDCF/SCCF Council, having considered document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.36/06, [FY25 Administrative Budget and Business Plan for the Least Developed Countries Fund and the Special Climate Change Fund](#), approves the proposed budget for the GEF Secretariat, Scientific and Technical Advisory Panel (STAP), and the Trustee as follows:
 - i. \$4,247,305 (GEF Secretariat), \$139,000 (STAP), and \$590,000 (Trustee) from the Least Developed Countries Fund; and
 - ii. \$1,341,899 (GEF Secretariat), \$139,000 (STAP), and \$130,000 (Trustee) from the Special Climate Change Fund.
2. The Council decides that, in the context of the Secretariat's analysis, the level of 11% indirect charge as set out in this document is the upper limit for the GEF, provided sufficient justification is provided by the World Bank for this indirect charge. It is noted that the indirect charge for the GEF is expected to exclude the cost of certain administrative services to be provided directly by the GEF.

Decision LDCF.SCCF 8/2024 FY25 Work Program and Budget for the Independent Evaluation Office of the GEF under the LDCF and SCCF

1. The Council, having reviewed document GEF/LDCF.SCCF.36/E/01, [FY25 Program and Budget for the Independent Evaluation Office of the GEF under LDCF and SCCF](#), approves the annual budget of \$347,788 to carry out the work program for fiscal year 2025. The budget is in line with the term of the evaluation work, which spans multiple years. The approved budget is being distributed as follows:

 - ii. \$144,715 from the Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF)
