



GEF Regional Latin America Workshop GEF Partnership's Projects for Global Environmental Benefits Generation September 3-5, 2024, Hilton Colon Hotel, Quito, Ecuador

1. Introduction

The GEF is half-way through the eighth-replenishment cycle (GEF-8), which cover the period July 2022 to June 2026. The approved GEF-8 replenishment package includes a comprehensive programming strategy and a set of policy commitments to support countries. This strategy includes a refocused country engagement strategy.

The GEF-8 Country Engagement Strategy (CES) focuses on comprehensively working with countries to:

- Ensure maximum impact of the collective use of GEF resources;
- Facilitate inclusive and sustained engagement with a wide range of stakeholders in recipient countries, including GEF Focal Points, relevant ministries, Convention Focal Points, executing agencies, civil society organizations, research institutions, the private sector and other interested groups;
- Ensure and facilitate coordination of country activities with regional and global scale actions where appropriate; and
- Develop and share best practices to maximize knowledge-sharing, learning, innovations, and scaling up of impact.¹

The renewed Country Support Programme (CSP) which provides capacity building to key stakeholder in the country including GEF focal points, Convention Focal points and CSOs among others will implement some aspects of the CES and this includes the regional workshops.

2. Objectives of the Regional Workshops

The regional workshop is designed to keep GEF Focal Points, Convention Focal points and other key stakeholders up to date with GEF policies and programming. The workshop for the Latin American countries takes place after similar workshop in Southern Africa, West Asia and North Africa, East and Central Asia, and the Caribbean.

The objectives of the workshop are to:

 Bring together GEF focal points, Convention Focal points, Civil Society Organizations and GEF Agencies to provide a briefing on the GEF 8 Programming directions and GEF policy recommendations.

- Provide countries with an opportunity to understand the GEF project cycle and explore the design of transformational GEF projects through interactive methods.
- Provide a platform for CSOs to engage with government counterparts and explore ways of coordinating and working together at the country level.
- Provide updates and engagement with Convention Focal points on key issues.
- Provide a learning and knowledge exchange opportunity through field visits and sharing of good practice.
- Engage bilaterally with each country delegation on the outlook for GEF-8 and portfolio implementation.

3. Participants

The GEF Secretariat will invite the following from each country:

- 1. Country Representatives: GEF Political and Operational Focal Points.
- 2. Convention Focal points from UNCCD, UNFCCCC, UNCBD, Stockholm and Minamata (5 per country).
- 3. Civils Society representatives including GEF CSO network representative, youth and IPLCs.
- 4. Key regional and sub-regional entities (self-sponsored).
- 5. GEF Agencies (self-sponsored).
- 6. Climate funds.

4. Meeting Format

The workshop will take place over three days with one day dedicated to visiting a GEF project. The first two days are dedicated to a program discussed and agreed on based on needs expressed by countries and priorities to be communicated from the GEF Secretariat.

The meetings are organized by the GEF Secretariat in close coordination with the GEF OFP office in the host country. The GEF Secretariat takes care of all costs associated with the workshop.
