Rationale and study issues

- The GEF invested in 172 energy efficiency projects in 1991-2010. The GEF family needs to know:
 - Distribution of the leveraged funds for EE investments by the GEF's resources
 - Distribution of GHG reductions because of GEF's EE investments
 - Conditions under which the GEF has achieved the maximum global benefits through its EE investments




Objective of the study

Overview of GEF's investment portfolio




Distribution of GEF approved CC projects in regions






Distribution of GEF approved CC/EE projects in agencies






Number of GEF's completed CC and EE projects






GEF's investments in completed CC and EE projects (\$ million)

Million US\$










Carbon intensity in largest countries




Energy Intensity in five largest developing countries and Japan
