We began 19 years ago, and today the GEF is the largest environment fund in the world that has invested \$9 billion in grants and leveraged \$40 billion in co-financing for more than 2,600 projects in 165 countries.

We have invested nearly \$3 billion in developing countries to promote the demonstration, deployment, and diffusion of technologies and practices related to energy efficiency, renewable energy, and sustainable urban transport. Our raison d'etre is to help developing countries make a smooth transition to a sustainable, low-carbon future. This is an imperative, not an option, for all countries.

In this regard, it is no accident that China is our single largest partner. We have invested in nearly 100 projects in China that can be found in 30 provinces, municipalities, and autonomous regions. Our goal is to protect the global environment while promoting sustainable development. We work closely with the Chinese government at the national, provincial, and local levels, as well as with civil society, and the private sector.

I am very glad to see that many of our guests tonight come from the private sector, who have participated in, and contributed to, many GEF projects in China: manufacturers of energy-efficient lamps, coking, brickmaking, and cement companies. Your technologies and your products hold the key to help China and the world make the transition onto a low-carbon development path. I thank you for your contributions.

We are also proud to be a pioneer in investing in the demonstration of cutting-edge, low-carbon technologies. One of the most visible examples is

the hydrogen fuel-cell buses. They buses funded by the GEF -

manufactured by the Shanghai Automotive Industry Corporation – are part

of the new energy, clean vehicle fleet shuttling visitors around the Expo

Park. These buses are vivid examples of how cities could become greener

cities, better cities, and low-carbon cities that enable better lives for their

citizens.

The success of the GEF in China cannot have been achieved without the

strong support of the GEF agencies. I want to take this opportunity to thank

our partner agencies – the World Bank, UNDP, and UNIDO – who are

represented here. I look forward to working with all of you to continue our

success in China and to support China in achieving a low-carbon future.

Last but not least, I want to thank Expo officials for offering the GEF the

opportunity to participate in the Expo with its Pavilion and for your strong

support to the GEF in organizing the GEF Honor Day.
