BACKGROUND

Several strategic documents, evaluations, and studies have stressed the importance of strengthened knowledge management, brokerage and learning across the partnership. The GEF 2020 strategy calls for transforming knowledge ecosystem that will multiply our impact as a global environmental solutions provider and enhance our operations. The Fifth Overall Performance Study of the GEF (OPS5) recommend establishment of the integrated knowledge management and capacity development strategy that would create mechanisms for permanent learning.

As of now, significant efforts take place in different parts of the GEF. However, the challenge for GEF-6 remains how to pull these together in a coherent manner and enable demand-driven learning across, inside, and outside the partnership that would catalyze the GEF impact.

OBJECTIVES OF THE SIDE EVENT

The goal of this side event is to provide a space to take stock of existing knowledge sharing across the GEF and jointly plan for the future.

While we all have contributed to the development of environmental knowledge, it's time to think how GEF partnership can help the GEF to generate knowledge on global environmental issues and eventually what changes need to happen - in the way we share knowledge within the partnership - to achieve this goal.

 - **Partnership to support major GEF Programs and Projects** (i.e. BRICKS x SAWAP – Are other examples?)
- **Third Goal: LEADING KNOWLEDGE ANALYSIS PIECES**
 - **To tackle drivers of environmental degradation** (What is felt as most urgent? Where can we make the greater, more meaningful contribution? What to do to start planning the first knowledge piece? How to take advantage of the GEF partnership?)
